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Forward

Executive Summary

This annual EMIS report 2018/2019, the first edition, shows the status of higher education in Biratnagar Nursing Campus (BNC). BNC an academic institution for higher studies comprises of one faculties and institute and one program. It is the constitute Campus of TU, IoM in Nepal. It has different unit to carry out academic and administrative work. It is offering both proficiency certificate and bachelor level program as in faculty. The total number of student enrolled were 70 in the year. Out of the students enrolled, in bachelor level 100% were female and in proficiency certificate level 85% female and 15% were male students.

The total number of graduates for the year were almost 100%. The total number of graduates for the year was 70. Out of which bachelor level 25 and 45 proficiency certificate level.

The total budget allocated for the year was 49732000. The capital expenditure is 13410000. The total number of faculty in the campus as full time teacher is 20 and part time teachers according to need and subject is 15. Most of the teachers in the campus have achieved master's degree in different faculties. Non-teaching staffs is 25. Among them, 3 are officers, 9 are non-officers and remaining 13 are supporting staffs. BNC focus on research and publication activities. Research activities are carried out in the campus along with students. Faculties also received grants in research by different organization as faculty research, mini research and Research development and innovation. Recently, BNC is planning to provide mini research grant to the faculties and students report writing support grant and students are benefited from such grants.

SECTION 1

Introduction

Tribhuvan University Institute of medicine is one of the pioneer college. Tribhuvan University, Biratnagar Nursing Campus is one of the historical constituent campus in province 1. It has its own land with College building, Hostel building, Administrative building, Teachers and employee quarter, separate visiting hall. Koshi Hospital, the major clinical area of campus located nearby in walking distance. There is MOU between the TU IOM and Ministry of Health. His Majesty's Government of Nepal, Ministry of Health established ANM training school in the year 2023 BS at Biratnagar. Later in 2029 BS, this programme was handed over to Tribhuvan University, the institute of Medicine. From 2037BS, Proficiency Certificate Level Nursing programme was started. In 2068/69, this campus began the Bachelor in Nursing Programme. Now this programme is upgraded into 3 years Bachelor in nursing science (BNS). Biratnagar Nursing Campus has an outstanding history of being ranked as the number of college of Nepal. It has record of cent percent pass result in PCL and BNS programme. Both programme are lunched in annual system. Now it is established as a well-known Campus in Province one in terms of quality production.

The Biratnagar Nursing Campus has undertaken the task of publishing basic statistical information about the higher education (bachelors) through its annual publication in the form EMIS report. This report presents information about the higher education in the campus though comprehensive data. It is expected that the information in this report will be useful for planning, policy making, designing programs and projecting resources of the higher education with special reference to Biratnagar Nursing Campus.

Biratnagar Nursing Campus established an Education Management Information System (EMIS) under the higher education project in 2020 A.D. It aims to provide updated information of the education system in the campus. This is our first attempt to bring out such a comprehensive report of statistical information. The main purpose of this volume is to provide adequate, accurate, timely and reliable data related to the education. This report comprises information about higher education institution (BN Campus), student enrollment,

pass graduates, gender parity index (GPI), teaching and non-teaching staffs, academic department and programs.

2. To administer appropriate processes to ensure EMIS data security

1.2 Methodology

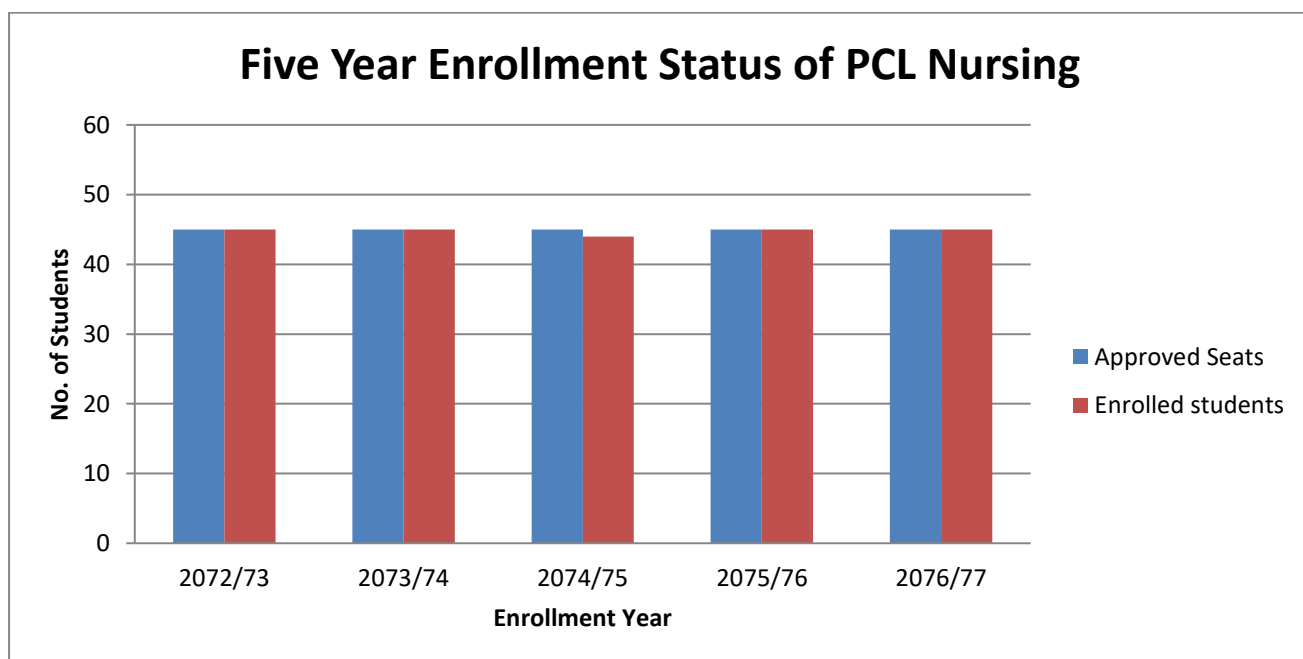

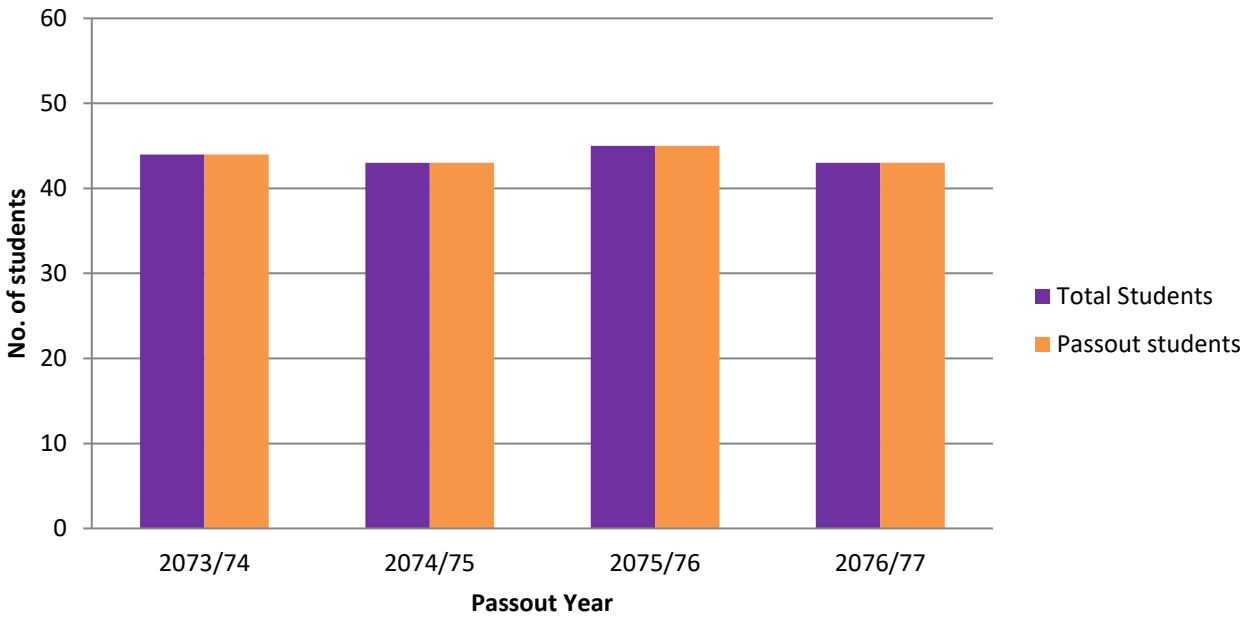

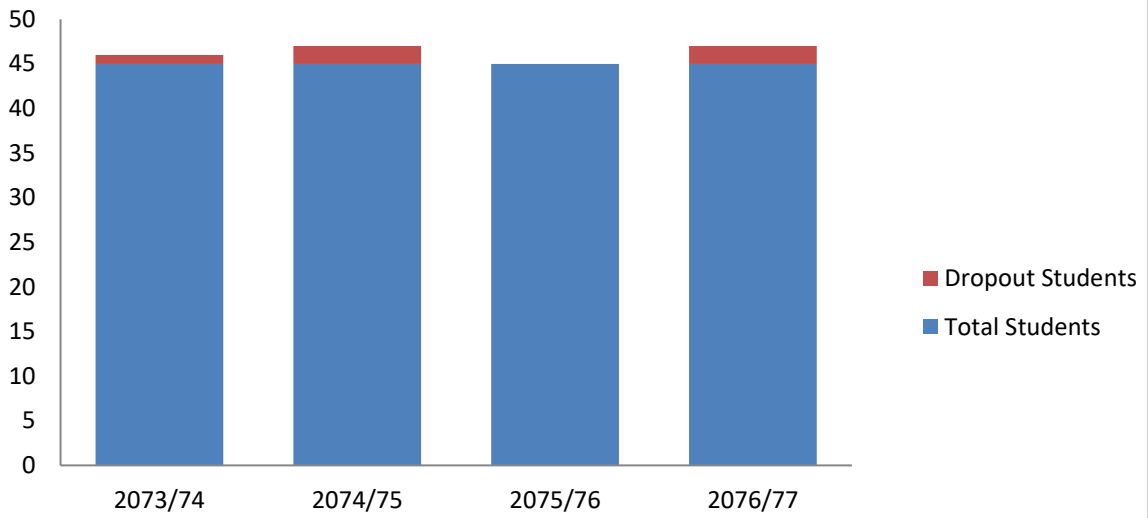

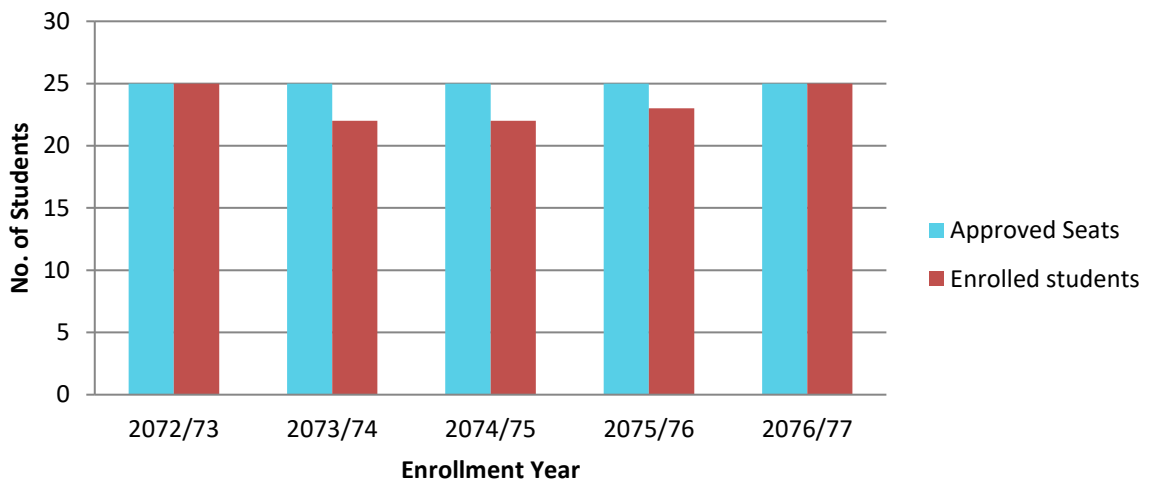
Four Year Passout Status of PCL Nursing



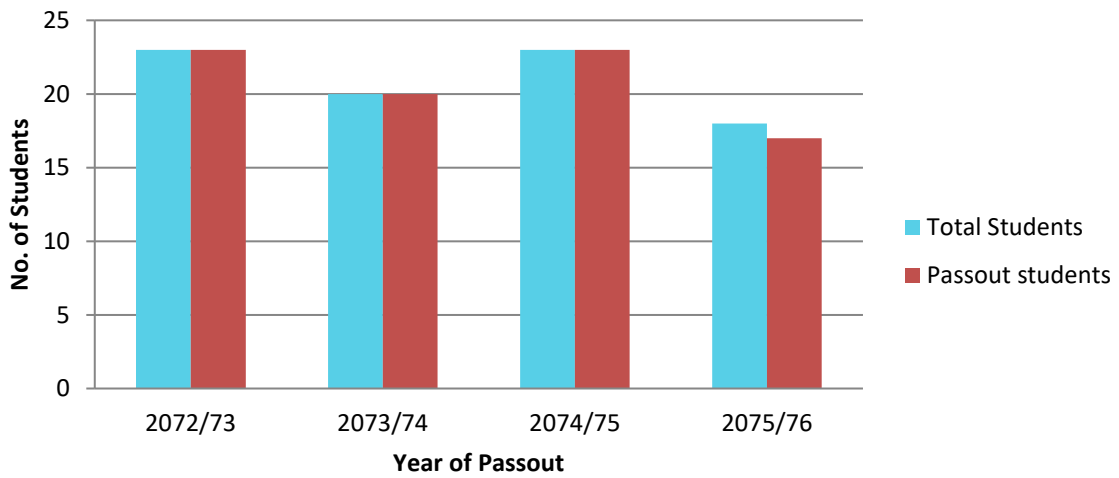
Four Year Dropout Status of PCL Nursing



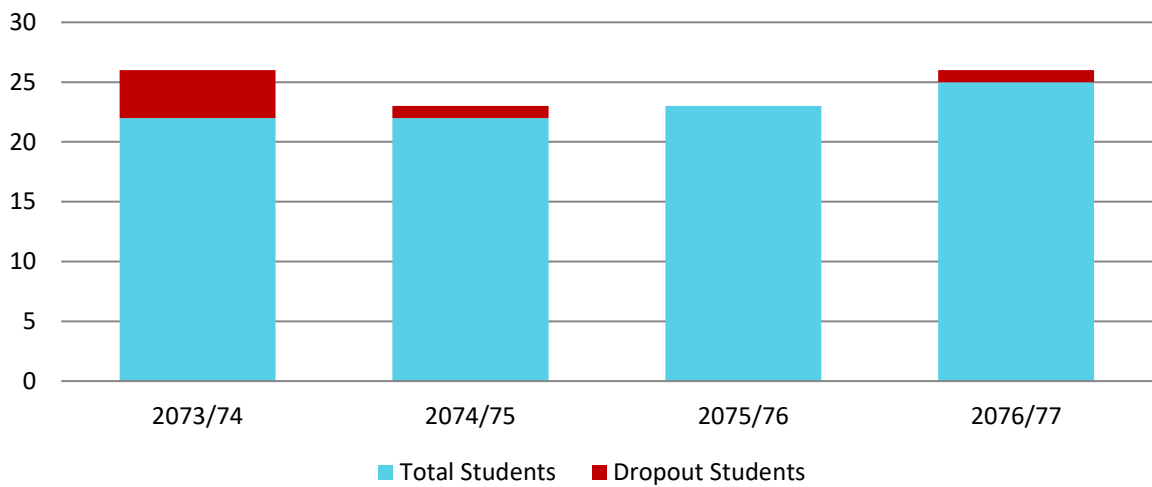
Five Year Enrollment Status of BNS



Four Year Passout Status of BNS

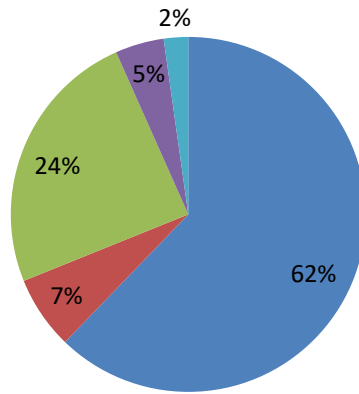


Dropout Status of BNS



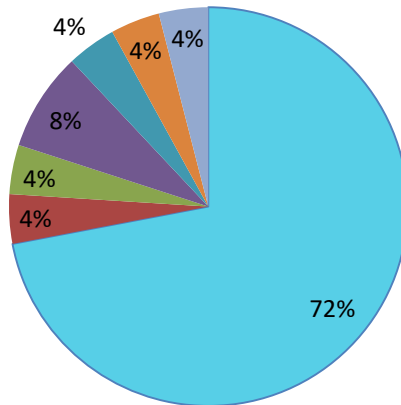
Provincewise enrollment of PCL students 2076/77

SECTION 4

Financial report of campus

In present scenario, various educational scopes have covered wide area in several sectors. There are numerous ongoing research and study activities on medical and nursing sciences paradigm that has reached certain peak. In order to blossom our nation with national and international level highly skilled and competent manpower in the field of nursing sciences, this Biratnagar Nursing Campus has been established as a constituent campus of Institute of Medicine, Tribhuvan University. This campus has been conducting the two programs of graduate level of Bachelor in Nursing (BNS) and Bachelor Science in Nursing along with PCL nursing program. The legal provision for conducting the program, scholarship of 75% of students and full payment of 25% of students with joint coordination among National Medical Education Commission, Ministry of Health and Population, Ministry of Education and Technology and Institute of Medicine (TU) has been regulated since the 2076/2077 academic year, and our college has gotten the opportunity to take the responsibility of those students. If financial condition of the Campus were sound, all the academic, administrative and research activities could be operated smoothly. Maximum part of the budget has to be used for salaries, scientific tools and equipment, repair and maintenance, Telephone and internet charges, electricity charges and so on. University provides the grant only for salaries and provident fund.

University provides the grant only for salaries and provident fund. All the academic, administrative and infrastructure expenses are borne by internal sources. From this fiscal year, National Medical Education Commission of Nepal government has provided the grant to those 75% students selected for the scholarship which equals to the expenses of those students admitted with full payment.

SECTION 5

Institution's Land area in Ropanees/Bighas (Katthas)/Square Meters: 3995.40 sqm

There is "Procurement and Construction Committee" that makes plans for the construction and maintenance of the campus infrastructure. The campus is located near the Koshi Hospital of Biratnagar Metropolitan City occupying 11katthas 16 dhur land. Campus owns land infrastructure with its own documents from dated 2065/4/27. With the approval from T.U. registrar, T.U. Post Graduate College of Biratnagar has provided 2 bigahas land for the campus for academic purpose to build new buildings for further program on 072/05/24. BNC in its owned land has started renovation in the existing buildings with focus in laboratories (midwifery, demonstration, fundamentals), parking area, extension and maintenance of dining hall, waste/drainage system management, Maintenance of top floor of hostel, painting of teacher's room and meeting hall, extension of parking, maintenance of teachers and administrative staff quarters, etc. with the decision of the committee and recently store room, permanent Reverse Osmosis Water Plant system, QAA unit (Research Management Cell-RMC office, SAT office, IQAC room) has been constructed. Similarly, to commence BSc Nursing program in future (program proposal submitted to TU IOM Dean office, TU Kirtipur on 2075/8/10), the committee has prepared a procurement plan with Engineer Consultancy to construct 3 storeyed multi-purpose BNC with main entrance, departments like- faculties room, administration sections, classroom, library, laboratories, garden area, parking, playground, visting area, auditorium hall, library extension with study rooms, canteen, hostel, toilet/bathroom, etc. Recently, ground, first and second floor is under construction and the future plan also includes constructing compound wall on the land donated by PG campus.

SECTION 9

Brief description of Campus

Tribhuvan University, Biratnagar Nursing Campus is one of the historical constituent campus in province 1. It has its own land with College building, Hostel building, Administrative building, Teachers and employee quarter, separate visiting hall. Koshi Hospital, the major clinical area of campus located nearby in walking distance. There is MOU between the TU IOM and Ministry of Health. There is good relationship between campus and hospital. His Majesty's Government of Nepal, Ministry of Health established ANM training school in the year 2023 BS at Biratnagar. Later in 2029 BS, this program was handed over to Tribhuvan University, the institute of Medicine. From 2037BS, Proficiency Certificate Level Nursing program was started. In 2068/69, this campus began the Bachelor in Nursing Program. Now upgraded into 3 years Bachelor in nursing science (BNS) Program. Biratnagar Nursing Campus has an outstanding history of being ranked as the number of college of Nepal. It has record of cent percent pass result in PCL and BNS program. Both programme are lunched in annual system. Now it is established as a well-known Campus in Province one in terms of quality production. Hundred percent theoretical classes are held according to Master Calendar of Operation. Clinical practice site is Koshi Hospital; quality practices are carried out in different department of KH. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been done between Ministry of Health and Population (MoHP) and the institute of Medicine (IOM).

Biratnagar nursing campus has separate buildings for administration, academic purpose and hostel for students. There are three separate buildings for residential purpose. Among them campus chief quarter is completely damaged and other two are in use by maintenance. There are 4 separate laboratories for student skill development namely fundamental lab, skill lab, biochemistry lab and community lab.

Biratnagar Nursing Campus has become one of the pioneer educational institutes in Nepal since its establishment. Nursing profession is mainly centralized in female gender. So it has also key role women empowerment and self-reliance. The products are engaged in renowned institute/hospital /NGO/INGO inside the country and abroad with attractive payment. In addition to educational activities, nursing students take part actively in extracurricular activities in indoor and outdoor competitive games. Different health related days are celebrated in campus and hospitals.

SECTION 10

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY

Introduction Information and Communications Technology (ICT) is technology that is used to handle communications processes such as telecommunications, broadcast media, intelligent building management systems, audiovisual processing and transmission systems, and network-based control and monitoring functions. ICT in education has been identified as an innovative and effective methods of teaching and learning in Biratnagar Nursing Campus. Campus is using EMIS software for data collection and smooth running of campus activities. Students as well as staff of the Biratnagar Nursing Campus can easily obtain an email id with domain name tuiombnc.edu.np. Besides that, Tribhuvan University also has provided TU official email accounts for every teacher, student and staff. Biratnagar Nursing Campus has a total dedicated bandwidth of 80 Mbps. Campus is providing fully dedicated wired and wireless internet facility to the hostels, all the departments. Every student in the hostel has their own username and password for internet access. EMIS Software Biratnagar Nursing Campus is using EMIS software for data collection and smooth running of campus activities. It is a web based system so that users can access it using their account from any place where the internet is available. All the data in the system is highly secured in the cloud applying the best security policy. All the academic information related to students and staff is recorded in software. Financial work is done through the system where all the fee information of students is stored. The system is also

running in the Library where all the information like Book records, book received & delivered by students and teachers are stored. Smart barcode system is used for proper functioning in the Library. Moreover, campus administrative as well as stock information can be stored in this system. E-attendance The attendances of all the teaching and non-teaching staffs are maintained by the use of Biometric Attendance This device is linked with our EMIS system on campus for the attendance report. All the leaves and holidays are systematically arranged in the system which made it very easy to keep the attendance log. Computer & Accessories This is the era of technology. Biratnagar Nursing Campus gives more priority to technology for a better education system. Every department in the campus uses computers for their regular work. Campus has about 22 computers, 14 laptops and 12 printers which are currently in use. Projectors are well equipped in every class as well as in the meeting hall. Overall campus has about 8 projectors in our campus.

Website Campus has its own dynamic website (www.tuiombnc.edu.np) where information and notice regarding campus are updated. IT part of the campus is regular update and proper maintenance of the website. It provides the information related to courses offered, faculty & staff, resources, gallery, association, events, publications, sports, news & notice, downloads, and contacts. Online Class Campus also provides online virtual class service for the students. Campus uses a licensed account of Zoom and Microsoft Teams for online class. Official email account has been provided by TU to every teacher and students of the campus for online class and other campuses.

Tribhuvan University's Rector Office issued a notice thanking institutions who were conducting online classes and requested others to follow suit. Similarly, the Registrar's Office also issued a notice on April 24 and requested institutions to conduct online classes other than practical courses following the decision of the Executive Council of TU. As per the Executive Council's decision on April 22, the Office of the Academic Council of TU decided to recognize online classes as formal ones. TU has issued a guideline for conducting online classes as the going lockdown has made it impossible to conduct physical classes regularly. The guideline also contains a code of conduct and 28 provisions for action. TU has warned to take action if students, teachers, and staff violate the code of conduct. Then, Campus Chief of Biratnagar Nursing Campus called the virtual meeting of faculties and decided to start online classes for bachelor level and PCL level students from. At first, general orientation on Zoom meeting was

given to all the faculties and classes were smoothly running to all levels of the program. TU provided the email ID and password to each of the faculties and staff as well as students of Biratnagar Nursing Campus for using Microsoft Team programme. On 22-23 June, 2020, Tribhuvan University organized the virtual training regarding use of Microsoft team for academic purpose to all the faculties of Biratnagar Nursing Campus and admin training for two personnel i.e. one administrative staff and one faculty. After that, various teams were created for each class and subjects, and general training was given to all the students.
